

COMMUNITY TREE PLANTING SCHEME

Following consultation at "Directors Walkabout" I have measured and designed suitable areas, where Moorhaven residents and visitors will be able to enjoy all year round interest and colour (whilst not creating extra work for "Grounds Maintenance Staff" or obstructing views from individual houses)

I have already spoken to several Moorhaven residents who are also enthused with the idea. I will give a month for further consultation before I register with "THE WOODLANDS TRUST COMMUNITY PLANTING SCHEME" giving them our areas, numbers of sapplings and species of trees we would like to plant next Autumn, as a community planting event.

The tree species will include: -hazel, hawthorn, guelder rose, spindle-berry, dogwood, dog rose, silver birch, rowan and wild cherry; and will arrive as "bare root whips" about 20cm-30cm (2') in size. I will also be asking The Woodland Trust if they can provide us with 12 Beech Sapplings that could be planted in existing spaces in the avenue of mature Beech Trees either side of main drive.
