

Adam will talk about how he lurched from academe via publishing into television, and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.





Rainfall at Shellwood Hill George Arnison

During August I recorded 121.5mm (just under 5") of rain at Shellwood Hill - thanks in most part to a couple of particularly wet days in the middle of the month. This was slightly under my ten-year average of 134mm for August...though fairly typically it was the wettest month since March!





Beryl's Bookworms – Juliet Collis

Our September book was The Girl in the Fog by Donato Carrisi, translated from the Italian by Howard Curtis. The book was set in a small remote alpine village, where 62 days previously, just before



Christmas, a teenage girl had gone missing. The story starts at day 62 where a famous detective who had previously been investigating the girl's disappearance, was found after a suspicious car accident with blood on his clothes. The police had taken him to a local psychiatrist as they wanted to know if he was telling the truth about the accident. Described as a psychological thriller, the events relating to the missing girl then start to unfold, but the chapters are not sequential, darting between the days before the disappearance and part way through the investigation, before finally returning to day 62 where the story started.

The investigation by the famous detective with a dubious past, having planted evidence in an earlier case to gain a conviction which was subsequently overturned, involved the manipulation of the media with searches of the local area and the creation of a shrine outside the girls house, in order to create a big news story. He is desperate to solve the mystery and restore his reputation, but sadly the fate of the missing teenager is largely forgotten with the unfolding events. There are lots of shifts in time and narrative which created suspense, but the ending was quite a surprise to all and not at all satisfactory. The author is a screenplay writer, so may have had the subsequent film more in mind when devising the plot.

There was mixed opinion from the group, with scores ranging between 1 and 4 out of 5, averaging at 2.5, which reflected the mixed reviews published online. For next month we will be reading Home Fire by Kamila Shamsie.

Eighteen members of the public attended the start of the September Parish Council Meeting, and space was tight in the Committee Room!

Questions related to feedback on development proposals and highway concerns. In particular, the A3121 Ludbrook junction where visibility was poor and traffic fast; the proposed lamp post on the verge at Undertown – DCC Cllr Hosking would consult the engineers about a suggested wall light or reduced height lamp post by the bench; and a 20mph speed limit for Ugborough – Cllr Hosking confirmed that speed tests were planned and a 20mph zone may be introduced if appropriate.

South Dartmoor Community Energy presented their proposals for an energy neutral/positive housing site on the edge of lyybridge, where they are proposing 30 affordable homes for rent or below market rate.

No infrastructure, employment land nor open space. Does not include road safety improvements through Bittaford or Wrangaton, nor access onto the A38 from the East of Ivybridge
- 6. Alterations and extension to existing dwelling house to include rebuilding of existing retaining boundary wall at Windbells, 5 Highfield Terrace, Bittaford Ref <u>0366/19</u> **Neutral. Prefer a more traditional design**
- 7. Variation of conditions 4 & 5 of planning consent 57/1308/11/F (Change of use of land to provide all weather sand school, erection of barn and creation of hard standing and storage area) to use as private business property providing therapy and training to equines at Land at Sx 666 559, Upper Lordwood Stables, Ugborough Ref 2188/19/VAR Support
- 8. Variation of conditions 2 on approved application 57/1920/12/F (Retrospective application for change of use of land to equestrian use and erection of security storage unit and horse exercising unit) to use as private business property providing therapy and training to equines at Land at Sx 666 559, Upper Lordwood Stables, Ugborough Ref 2190/19/VAR Support

The Budget received its six months review, and I note that not many grants have been made – although Modbury Caring was awarded £100 at the meeting. If your community group needs grant support, have a look at our Grant Aid Policy at

Ugborough Parish Council will not be buying the public toilets in Bittaford & Ugborough! This momentous decision has been made after SHDC confirmed they would not be undertaking outstanding repairs and disabled improvements prior to the transfer. Also, they would impose a 75% 'overage', which meant that, if the Parish Council tried to sell or lease part of the property in order to finance the maintenance or improvements of its toilets, then

SHDC would take 75% of the proceeds! Councillors reasoned that, at community events in the Square, portable toilets could be hired.

Defibrillator Training is to be held at Bittaford Community Hall at 7 p.m. on Wednesday 9th October. Let me know if you wish to attend – we now have defibrillators in Ugborough, Bittaford, Moorhaven & Wrangaton – and your training could save a life!

Complaints have been received of overgrown hedgerows, so now is a timely reminder of landowners' obligations. Hedges are overgrown if they are more than 1 metre over the carriageway or forcing vehicles over a centre line. Depending on the use of the road, DCC can ask for trees to leave a 5.03m clearance above the carriageway. If the landowner fails to act on a DCC notice, then DCC can carry out the work and reclaim the cost. Use the DCC website https://www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/report-a-problem/ to report a problem.

A3121 proposals will have been decided by the DCC Cabinet by the time you read this Newsletter. Councillors considered that money allocated for squaring up junctions would be better spent on a roundabout at Kitterford Cross, or at least a staggered junction. Speeds could be reduced by a combination of signage and rumble strips.

CrimeStoppers has proved very effective in fighting crime. It promises to be 100% anonymous, and you can contact it on crimestoppers-uk.org or 0800 555111.

St. Peter's Church, Ugborough - Peter Povey

Now that the project for the re-casting of the Bells of St. Peter's Church is complete, and Bellringing is safeguarded for generations to come, the Parochial Church Council needs to address other issues facing the thousand-year-old Church building.

In 2014 it obtained grants for the repair of the North Aisle Roof, especially from the *Heritage Lottery Fund*. This was the second phase of a projected extended programme, and it is now time to turn towards implementation of the third phase. This involves repairs to the internal and external walls of the Church, particularly to the Chancel, the South Chapel and the South Aisle, where there is significant fungal growth in the wall plaster; stabilisation of the medieval wooden roof bosses; window repairs; and the introduction of an adequate heating system. Those readers who visit the Church in the late Autumn, Winter and early Spring will be familiar with the cold and damp during these seasons.

The proposed new heating system has been designed to make the Church comfortable year-round for worship and community events, whilst contributing to the preservation of the building. Running parallel with the building works, the Church Council wishes to foster greater appreciation of the heritage of Ugborough's oldest building, and enhance the visitor experience

A Faculty approving the proposed works has been issued, and the Parochial Church Council has started to apply for funding to grant-giving bodies towards the £400- 450k needed for implementation. Already the Devon Historic Churches Trust has given a grant to the Church. A Consultation Document has been produced on the proposals, and this has been distributed widely to organisations within Ugborough Parish and beyond.

Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child 2019 Shoebox Appeal - Kate Brampton

Each year Ugborough and its surrounding area have supported this Appeal — if you, or a group of you feel able to support this appeal this year for needy children and young people overseas by filling a shoebox (or part of a shoebox, or a donation of some shoebox items or money) for Christmas it would be much appreciated.

In 2016 32 Gift Boxes went to Belarus, in 2017 42 Gift Boxes went to Albania and in 2018 48 Gift Boxes went to Bulgaria.

A shoebox can be for a boy or girl for age groups 2 to 4, 5 to 9 and/or 10 to 14 years old. Items to be provided can include new toys, school supplies, hygiene items etc — more detail is provided in the leaflets (this year, changes include no toothpaste, liquids or sweets). There is also opportunity to donate towards the suggested £5 donation required for each box including shipping.

Leaflets and shoeboxes will available at the back of the Church from the beginning of October 2019 and at the two USS Markets (Village Hall) during October 2019.

Filled shoeboxes including the £5 donation can be expensive to do on an individual basis, so if you want to support by donating just one or two items or a monetary donation, there will also be a collection box at the above locations.

Shoeboxes should be filled and <u>returned by the end of October 2019</u> to the back of the Church, a USS Market (12th and/or 26th October 2019) or to Kate Brampton at Hill House, Ugborough (opposite Village Hall).

The shoeboxes will be blessed during a Church Service in early November 2019 before they start their journey.

Whilst we won't know which country(ies) the shoeboxes will go to before they start their journey, where registered online they will be tracked again so we can be informed which country(ies) they go to after they are delivered.
